About Us

Canadian Parents for French is a nationwide, research-informed, volunteer organization that represents 35,000 members across Canada and champions the opportunity to learn and use French for all those who call Canada home. In New Brunswick, there are 4000+ members who are committed to this mission as part of the network.

Originally a small group of concerned parents who met in Ottawa founded Canadian Parents for French in 1977. These parents wanted to ensure that all children would have the opportunity to become bilingual in the Canadian school system.

Canadian Parents for French has evolved into a proactive National Network with 12 Branches and offices and over 140 Chapters, serving its members and educational stakeholders in communities nationwide. We recognize that our CPF National office is located on the unceded lands of the Anishinaabe people, that our Branch offices are located on lands of over 24 Indigenous peoples whose contributions and historic importance must be connected to our collective commitment to the promise and challenge of Truth and Reconciliation in all our communities.

In 2021-2022, Canadian Parents for French worked together as a national network to lead governance initiatives in support of Canadian parents and FSL learners, with a focus to building strong, inclusive, equitable and shared leadership, supporting engaged membership and volunteers, and delivering relevant, quality programming to parents and youth learning and using French. In New Brunswick, a focus has been on the review of the provincial Official Languages Act, which has also been looking at improving French Second Language Instruction, ensuring students and families had the resources they needed to continue learning French in a COVID-19 context, and by pivoting programming online to ensure that families still had opportunities to use French outside of the classroom.

We promise you, our members, and stakeholders, to listen, share our learnings with you and engage you in this important and ongoing work that CPF NB, as part of the CPF Network, is undertaking.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



Our 2021-2022 fiscal year was another great success for Canadian Parents for French New Brunswick (CPF NB) with thanks to our dedicated staff, volunteers, partners, and stakeholders.

Similar to the last fiscal year, the majority of CPF NB programming required significant adaptation and pivoting to virtual programming. Several core CPF NB program elements, including our *Concours d'art oratoire*, were required to be held virtually. Our annual Snider Mountain Ranch (SMR) camp was not able to be held again in May 2021 due to the pandemic restrictions.

This year, CPF NB demonstrated the impact of our

partnerships. A specific focus was placed on rapprochement, which was demonstrated in our partnership with the *Société de l'Acadie du Nouveau-Brunswick* (SANB) who collaborated with CPF NB to submit a brief on the Government of New Brunswick's review of the Official Languages Act (OLA) and French Second Language (FSL) learning.

In the latter part of this fiscal year, the Government of New Brunswick announced their release of their report on improving FSL. This was, and will continue to be, a focus point for the organization as we continue to move forward and seek to ensure a strong and equitable French Immersion system for New Brunswickers.

During this year, we also bid farewell to three long-serving board members who have contributed countless volunteer hours to CPF NB and have had an immeasurable impact on FSL in New Brunswick: Dorothy White, Greg Keith, and Robert Bernier. Each of these former Board members will continue to serve CPF NB in their new capacity as Advisory Committee Members. On behalf of the organization, and the many French Immersion students (including myself!) that you have positively impacted during your time on the board, thank you.

While this year was a great success, there are more challenges and opportunities that are ahead. CPF NB looks forward to continuing to work with network counterparts, stakeholders, students, families, and partners to continue our important work.

Concours d'art oratoire

Concours d'art oratoire, is our signature public speaking event that showcases French Second Language (FSL) students' proficiency in French, not to mention their ability to weave a tale or present a compelling argument in front of a large live audience. Due to COVID-19 and related closures of schools, many classroom, school and district levels of the annual *Concours d'art oratoire* were not held.

CPF NB quickly pivoted to host our own Concours virtuel with over 60 students registered, 28 volunteer judges,

and **4 guest speakers**. Following the provincial *Concours*, the top three speeches from each category continued to the National *Concours*, with one New Brunswick student, Sameen Saeed, winning first place in the Post-Intensive French (PIF) category. **45 recorded speeches from New Brunswick** were also included in the **CPF National Virtual Concours**.

French Camps & Virtual Programming

In light of the COVID-19 pandemic, CPF NB had to re-think our usual youth programming since our Snider Mountain Ranch camp, another signature event, could not take place.

CPF NB created and strengthened partnerships with organizations that could engage students in programming and virtual camps, such as with *Kids Code Jeunesse*, an organization that teaches how to code, and Snapology, another STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) organization that was able to immerse students in this experience in their second language.

These programs were ran with a number of community partners, including schools, the Nutrien Civic Centre (Sussex), and local Girl Guide Chapters.

Bursaries

YOUTH

CPF NB is proud to offer a number of bursaries each year in addition to those that are offered by partners at our events, such as *Concours*.

2021 Richard Rice Memorial Bursary:

Annually, CPF NB awards a \$1000 bursary to a New Brunswick student pursuing post-secondary education in French in memory of Richard Rice, a long-time advocate for French Immersion and a long-serving volunteer of CPF NB. The 2021 winner was Amy Lorette, who will be pursuing studies in Education at *l'Université de Moncton*.

In addition to this bursary, the Canadian Parents for French New Brunswick/FAÉUNB bursary, provided annually to a *Université de Moncton* student following a \$10,000 donation from CPF NB to the University in 2017, was once again offered this year. This was offered to Virgina Wilson, originally from St. Stephen, who is pursuing her Bachelor of Education degree at *l'Université de Moncton*.



French Tutoring

CPF NB saw a significant increase in demand for French tutoring opportunities throughout the COVID-19 pandemic. We continued to offer our tutor subsidy to members, which allows members to access French tutoring sessions with Apprendre-Franco Fun for free, with CPF NB paying for the courses. These courses are offered by retired teachers, current educators, and education students.



CPF ADVOCACY IN ACTION

Government of New Brunswick Review of French Second Learning

In 2020, two commissioners, Judge Yvette Finn and John McLaughlin, were appointed to undertake a review of the NB Official Languages Act and find ways to improve second-language learning. They were mandated to oversee the review process, to consult with the public and key stakeholders, to review suggestions and recommendations submitted during the process and to present a final report with recommendations to the provincial government.

In September 2021, CPF NB submitted a brief on improvements that could be made to our system. The Commissioners' final report was published in December 2021.



CPF ADVOCACY IN ACTION

In September of 2021, CPF NB released it's position paper submitted to the Government of New Brunswick during their consultation on the modernization of the provincial Official Languages Act, which also looked at reviewing French Second Language in the province.

- Brief was co-submitted by 2 partner organizations
- 5 aspects of FSL Programs were studied
- 26 Recommendations were tabled
- 46 pages

CPF NB worked with Dr. Joseph Dicks, the retired Director of the Canadian Institute for French Second Language Learning at the University of New Brunswick, to produce the research-informed report. The full report was also translated into French.

It was also endorsed by, and co-submitted with, our Francophone counterparts, *la Société de l'Acadie du Nouveau-Brunswick*, a great example of both rapprochement between our linguistic communities and advocacy in action!








CPF Mary Joyce Booth Grant Awarded in 2021-22

PILLAR C: Advocating for Universal Access


CPF New Brunswick strengthened existing partnerships and continued to pursue opportunities to establish new partnerships in the effort to increase coordination and build alliances with key partners.
